Dear Members of the Service Award Committee,

In 2020, the State of Connecticut passed an amendment to the Volunteer Firefighter and EMS Personnel Tax Relief Act, doubling the maximum benefit from \$1,000 per year per individual to \$2,000. The current tax abatement program has not increased since its inception in the 1990s. While this is not mandatory, due to the increased inflation and cost of living, approving this increase would help to provide maximum relief to those individuals who volunteer their time and skills to serve the town. In the program year ending in 2022, 37 volunteers qualified for the service award and tax abatement benefit, 15 of those volunteers have over ten years of service but are maxed out at the current plan ceiling of 10 years, \$1,000. I am proposing the financial increase of the tax abatement program in one of two ways. The first would be to double the program from \$100 per year to \$200 per year, keeping the maximum of 10 years; however, the financial maximum would be \$2,000 as opposed to the current \$1,000. Using the figures from the most recent year, the total amount of funding would increase from \$23,500 to \$47,000. The second proposal would be to increase the maximum number of years of the program from 10 to 20, keeping the \$100 per year increment. Using the same figures, the increase in funding would change from \$23,500 to \$32,500. This would also increase the maximum permanent relief benefit from \$1,000 to \$2,000, reached after 20 or more years of service and given after age 65. As the Tax Abatement Program is a town ordinance, the change would need to be voted on by the Board of Selectmen and then taken to a town meeting for approval.

Resolution to Acquire Drainage Easement (123 Beacon Valley Road)

The Town of Beacon Falls, Connecticut (the "Town") shall acquire, by purchase, by eminent domain, or otherwise, a stormwater drainage easement across that certain piece or parcel of real property situated in the Town known as 123 Beacon Valley Road (the "Premises").

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 7-148(c)(3) the Town has the power and authority to acquire real property, or an interest therein, by purchase or by condemnation, for the purposes of the Town or for any public use or purpose; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 7-148(c)(6)(B) and (C) the Town has the power and authority (i) to lay out, construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, control and operate public highways within the Town, and (ii) to layout, construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate drainage systems, including for the drainage of surface water from a public highway; and

WHEREAS, the Town is in the process of reconstructing a certain portion of Beacon Valley Road, a public highway within the Town, and has designed multiple structures for the drainage of stormwater from said highway; and

WHEREAS, the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of a public highway and the drainage of surface water from said highway are important municipal and public purposes and are necessary for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the reconstruction of said public highway, the Town seeks to acquire a permanent easement 20 feet in width and consisting of 1,160 square feet, more or less, for the drainage of surface water from Beacon Valley Road on, over, under and across the Premises (the "Drainage Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the appraised fair market value of the Drainage Easement is \$600; and

WHEREAS, to date, the Town has been unsuccessful in its attempts to purchase the Drainage Easement from the owner of the Premises.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town immediately acquire the Drainage Easement for the municipal and public purposes described above, and if the owner of the Premises shall continue to refuse, fail or neglect to convey the Drainage Easement to the Town for its appraised fair market value, then the Town shall proceed to acquire the Drainage Easement by eminent domain in the manner provided by Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 48-12.

Resolution to Acquire Drainage Easement (145 Beacon Valley Road)

The Town of Beacon Falls, Connecticut (the "Town") shall acquire, by purchase, by eminent domain, or otherwise, a stormwater drainage easement across that certain piece or parcel of real property situated in the Town known as 145 Beacon Valley Road (the "Premises").

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 7-148(c)(3) the Town has the power and authority to acquire real property, or an interest therein, by purchase or by condemnation, for the purposes of the Town or for any public use or purpose; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 7-148(c)(6)(B) and (C) the Town has the power and authority (i) to lay out, construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, control and operate public highways within the Town, and (ii) to layout, construct, reconstruct, repair, maintain and operate drainage systems, including for the drainage of surface water from a public highway; and

WHEREAS, the Town is in the process of reconstructing a certain portion of Beacon Valley Road, a public highway within the Town, and has designed multiple structures for the drainage of stormwater from said highway; and

WHEREAS, the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and repair of a public highway and the drainage of surface water from said highway are important municipal and public purposes and are necessary for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Town; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the reconstruction of said public highway, the Town seeks to acquire a permanent easement 20 feet in width and consisting of 514 square feet, more or less, for the drainage of surface water from Beacon Valley Road on, over, under and across the Premises (the "Drainage Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the appraised fair market value of the Drainage Easement is \$220; and

WHEREAS, to date, the Town has been unsuccessful in its attempts to purchase the Drainage Easement from the owner of the Premises.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town immediately acquire the Drainage Easement for the municipal and public purposes described above, and if the owner of the Premises shall continue to refuse, fail or neglect to convey the Drainage Easement to the Town for its appraised fair market value, then the Town shall proceed to acquire the Drainage Easement by eminent domain in the manner provided by Connecticut Gen. Statutes Section 48-12.
