Dear members of the Board of Selectmen,

Attached you will find the library's July service report and financial report.

Areas of note from the July Service report:

- The overall program attendance for adults and children has seen a positive increase.
- Public computer use is available again without appointment.
- Website visits are up by almost 50%
- Volunteers have returned to helping in the library.
- Overall circulation of materials has increased from the same month last year.
- Items being lent to other libraries and borrowed from other libraries through interlibrary loan has increased.
- Notary services are still being widely utilized in the library.
- July's programming was focused on Summer Reading. We had 68 children, 19 teens, and 22 adults actively participate.
- Children logged reading time in a custom booklet created by librarian, Kerri Vardon. Children were able to earn special beads and brag tags.
- Weekly in person and take and make crafts were offered for the children. We had 23 participants attend in person crafts and 114 take home craft bags go out over four weeks.
- Preschool story time was held as well as story time sessions for United Day School's big and little kid groups.
- On Mondays, we held a virtual program in Animal Crossing. 30 teens participated over a 4-week period.
- The outdoor movie night had 74 viewers. We would like to extend a special thanks to Parks & Rec and especially Steve Moffat who really helped make this happen. The Friends of the Library provided complimentary snacks and we would like to thank the 150<sup>th</sup> Committee for the purchase of the screen.
- Chef Rob has continued his Monday night cooking camp on Facebook. 128 people participated over 4 weeks.
- The last spice club bag had 42 adults, 2 teens and 6 child participants.
- Adult programs included a painted porch sign that was offered as a take and make activity which had 16 adults participate
- The DEEP bear talk had 14 in person attendees.
- Storyteller Monica J. Peterson spoke at the gazebo. 29 people participated by zoom or in person.
- The teen craft was a resin keychain. There were 15 teens and 4 adults that attended.

Areas of note regarding the July FY 21 22 Financial Report:

• The computer line is at 64% expended. This is common for the start of the fiscal year with the purchase of databases for the library. Other line items have seen an increase for this time compared to last year due to last years pandemic closure. Line items are where they are expected.

On August 18<sup>th</sup> we will have an all-ages end of summer reading pizza party with Riverside Reptiles at the Recreation Center. We will also be starting a monthly coffee club bag, a teen murder mystery night and another outdoor movie night. Fred Simpson will be giving his full performance on September 9<sup>th</sup> at St. Michael's Gazebo which will include poetry and percussion.
